## CHANGING THE DYNAMICS OF INT'L HIGHER EDUCATION LOCALLY

Every year, escalating batches of A level qualified students leave our shores for higher education in universities abroad that offer degree courses which prepare them for their future job aspirations.

Many of these students do not return to Sri Lanka as their foreign degrees are a passport to joining the international employment market in the profession of their choice. With high IQ levels, the best international professional qualifications, natural adaptability and desire to begin life in a developed country, most of these students settle down to a life in the adopted country where they completed their university degrees. Some even migrate to other developed countries depending on their job markets.

Although many local higher education institutions offer degrees in affiliation with top-level foreign universities, students who follow these courses have to go to the affiliated university abroad to finally complete the university degree.

But the astronomical cost of higher education in a foreign university, with the current rising currency conversion against the Sri Lanka rupee, is a heavy financial burden on parents who want the best available education for their children.

Is this the first-ever foreign university degree to be conducted totally in Sri Lanka?

Yes, it is our biggest achievement for 2022. For the first time in the history of our higher education, SLIIT takes pride in being the first higher education institution to offer a complete degree programme by Curtin University, Australia. Sri Lankan students can now complete a full Australian university degree in Sri Lanka for the first time.

As a prestigious and well recognized higher education campus, what are the upcoming foreign collaboration programmes offered by SLIIT Business School for 2022?

universities in Australia and one of only 13 in the world to achieve the "QS Five Stars Plus" recognition.
